These admission guidelines apply to Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) seeking entry into Bladen Community College's LPN to RN Bridge: Traditional Program. It is the applicant's responsibility to thoroughly review and understand the Admission Policies and Procedures outlined in this document. The criteria listed are valid for the 2026–2027 application year.

Note: LPNs may also apply to the traditional Associate Degree Nursing Program as an alternative entry pathway; however, they must meet all requirements outlined in the Nursing Program Admission Criteria for that program.

BLADEN COMMUNITY COLLEGE LPN to RN Bridge: Traditional Program ADMISSION POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Bladen Community College maintains an "open door" admission policy; however, due to the complexity of health care, the legal responsibilities of nursing practice, and the academic rigor required, selective admission criteria are in place for the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program. The ADN program upholds the college's commitment to nondiscriminatory and inclusive access for all qualified applicants who meet these criteria. Successful applicants are admitted in the spring semester.

Student applications will be processed only after all requirements have been fulfilled. All admission requirements must be completed by the established deadline to receive consideration. The Vice President of Student Services and staff are responsible for administering general college admission policies, while the Director of Nursing and Allied Health—along with advisement from the Associate Degree Nursing faculty—holds final decision-making authority for program entry, as admission numbers are limited.

The nursing applicant is responsible for ensuring all requirements are met by the established *deadline of November 6*, 2026.

All guidelines, policies, and deadlines apply equally to every applicant; therefore, no exceptions can be made. All applicants to the LPN to RN Bridge: Traditional Program must meet the following requirements:

- 1. **Admission Criteria** Locate the LPN to RN Bridge: Traditional Program Admission Criteria on the BCC Nursing Program Resources webpage: https://www.bladencc.edu/advising-aid/student-advising/nursing-program-resources/
- 2. **College Application** Complete the college application process in the Office of Student Services or via the BCC website.
- 3. **Transcripts** Submit *official* high school or high school equivalency transcript to the registrar's office. In addition, applicants should also submit *official* college transcripts for any postsecondary courses completed. Student copies will not be accepted.
- 4. **Counseling** Consult a Student Success and Engagement representative for course advisement.
- 5. **Information Session** Attend one virtual information session to learn more about the nursing program admission process. Attendance is recommended but not mandatory for admission. Email mnorris@bladencc.edu to register beginning two weeks prior to the session.

- 6. **Pre-requisites (items required** *prior* **to admission)** Complete the following prerequisites, courses, or their equivalents as determined by the Registrar.
 - A. Current unencumbered license as a Licensed Practical Nurse in NC or a Nurse Licensure Compact State
 - B. Completion of the following courses with a "C" or higher. Transcripts must be on file with BCC by the application due date. **Note:** These courses do not have an expiration. timeframe.
 - a. BIO 168
 - b. BIO 169
 - c. ENG 111
 - d. HUM 115
 - e. PSY 150
- 7. Nursing Entrance Test Complete the Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)
 - **Reading** Key ideas and details; craft and structure; integration of knowledge & ideas (45 items, 55 minutes)
 - **Math** Numbers and algebra; measurement and data (38 items, 57 minutes)
 - **Science** Human anatomy & physiology; biology; chemistry; scientific reasoning (50 items, 60 minutes)
 - English and Language Usage Conventions of standard English; knowledge of language; using language and vocabulary to express ideas in writing (37 items, 37 minutes)

Applicants must demonstrate a minimum comprehensive score of 58 on the ATI TEAS Test to be eligible for admission.

A total of four (4) TEAS scores will be considered for admission. Applicants are eligible to take and submit one TEAS score for each of the following time periods:

4	July 1, 2026	November 6, 2026

Note: If a student takes the TEAS test more than once within the designated time periods, only the score from the earliest attempt in that period will be considered eligible for the nursing admissions process. Any additional TEAS attempts during the same period will be considered invalid and will not be reviewed as part of the admissions process.

Applicants taking the TEAS at other institutions and via ATI virtual proctor must submit *official* records of their scores via ATI to BCC. All official TEAS scores must be received by November 6, 2026. Student copies will not be accepted.

8. **Nursing Program Application** -- Complete the LPN to RN Bridge program application and submit directly to the Director of Nursing and Allied Health @ mnorris@bladencc.edu by November 6, 2026.

Applicants must be in good academic standing at the time of application and remain in good academic standing for the entirety of the nursing program.

APPLICATION REVIEW AND SCORING PROCESS

A point system is used as an objective means for evaluating LPN to RN Bridge program candidates. Applicants are ranked based on a formula that assigns numerical values to specific criteria. Potential points allocations are listed below. Applicants with tied point totals will be determined by evaluating points in prerequisite courses.

ACCEPTANCE TO THE PROGRAM

- Acceptance Letters Acceptance letters and/or email will be sent by December 4, 2026.
 If a selected applicant declines acceptance, fails to register during the designated registration period, or fails to submit all required documentation, alternates will be granted admission based upon their rank and the number of positions available.
 Information related to uniforms, supplies, and required student documents will be attached to the acceptance letter.
- 2. **Orientation** Successful applicants accepted into the LPN to RN Bridge: Traditional Program will receive orientation to the nursing student handbook policies and procedures on the initial class day of NUR 214.
- 3. CPR and Health Evaluation Form Submit current health/physical form with proof of current immunizations, TB skin test, influenza vaccination, and documentation of a seated American Heart Association Healthcare Provider CPR certification. Students who fail to submit the required student records by the designated due date will forfeit their seat in the program. Note: CPR certification must be obtained through a seated course that includes a skills practice component.
- 4. **Criminal Background Check and Drug Testing** Be advised clinical agencies require background checks and drug testing before a student may enter their facility. Clinical agencies reserve the right to deny any student access to a facility based on their criminal background or a positive drug test. *If access is denied to the clinical facility, the student will be unable to complete the requirements of the nursing program, which will result in immediate dismissal from the program.* Criminal background checks and drug testing will be arranged following acceptance to the program.
- 5. **Program Admission**—Successful applicants will begin the program in Spring 2027 with NUR 214, which introduces LPNs to the conceptual basis of nursing theory. Following the completion of NUR 214, students will merge with the traditional ADN cohort to complete second year curriculum requirements according to the Bladen Community College Associate Degree Nursing program of study. **Note:** This may include repeating select nursing courses if previously taken in another ADN program.

Note: Program capacity is limited to the top 10 candidates who achieve the highest competitive point scores and fully meet all prerequisite requirements outlined in the admission criteria. If fewer than 10 candidates satisfy the prerequisite requirements by the application deadline, additional applicants who are completing prerequisites during the Fall 2026 semester may be considered at the discretion of the Director of Nursing and Allied Health. Applicants who receive provisional acceptance must successfully complete all required prerequisites by the end of the Fall 2026 semester in order to enroll in the program in January 2027.
